TRAFFIC SAFETY



It is everyone's kuleana (responsibility) to be mindful of changing roadway conditions in construction zones. **A few minutes of patience and alertness on the road can save a life.** Below are a few helpful tips for your morning and afternoon commutes.

PLAN AHEAD

Lane reductions and turn restrictions may impact your commute. Allow extra time through the construction zone, especially during school drop-off and pick-up times.

EYES FORWARD

Road conditions may change around a work area. Minimize distractions and stay alert for construction workers, vehicles or pedestrians.

SLOW MEANS SAFE

Follow posted speed limits while traveling within construction zones. Construction zone speed limits have been lowered to 25 miles per hour.
